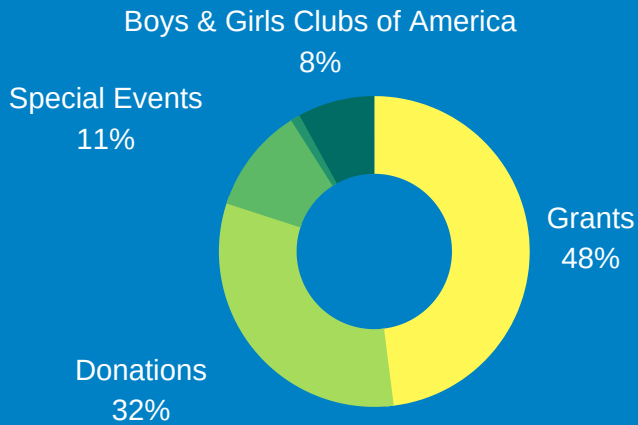

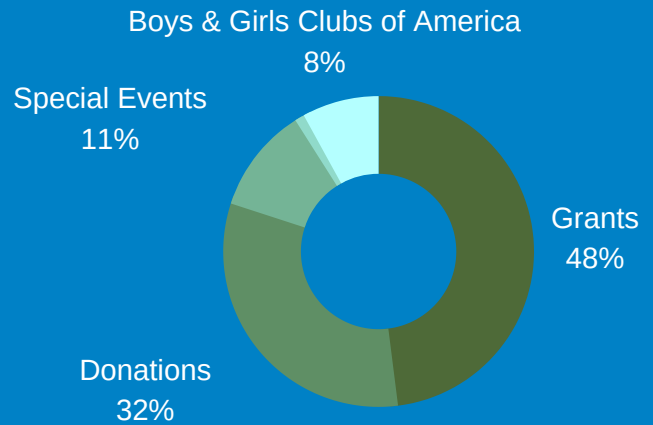

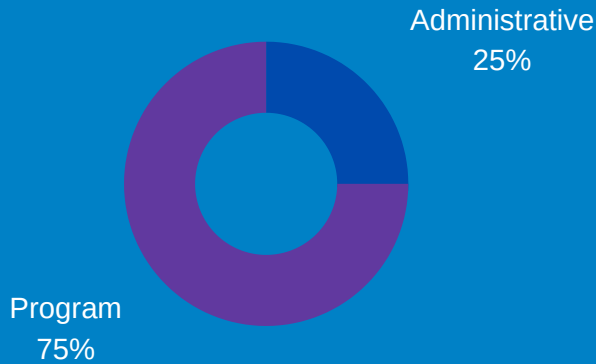
2018 INCOME



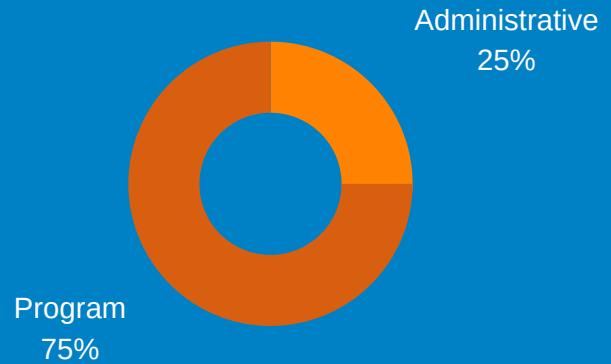
2019 INCOME

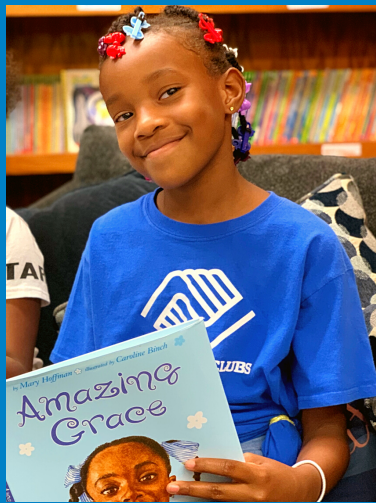

CHARACTER & CITIZENSHIP

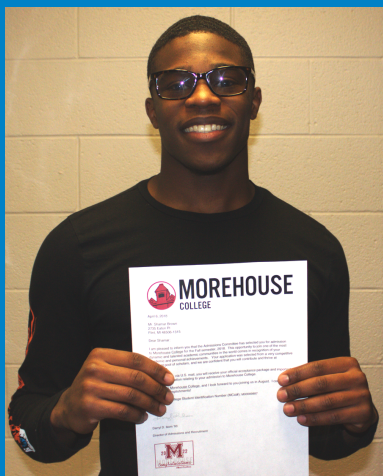
Helping youth become responsible and caring citizens, these programs also provide leadership opportunities.

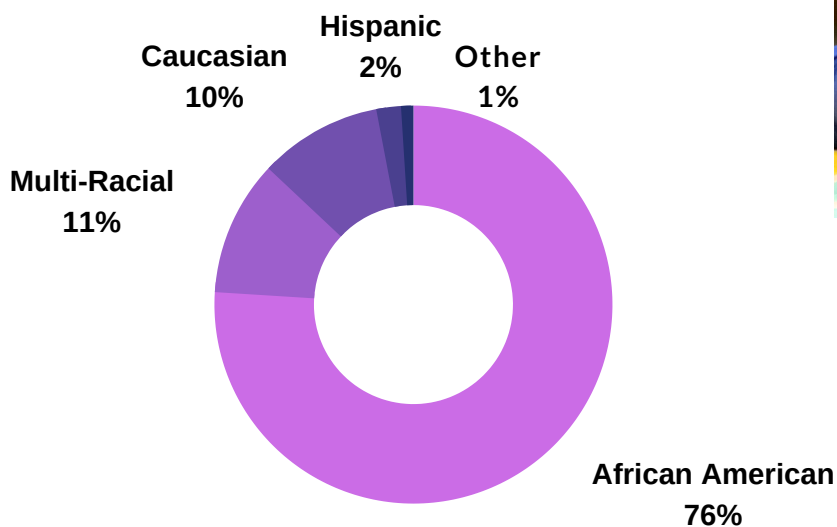

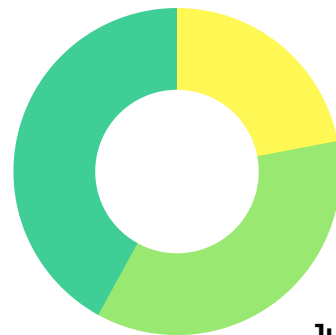
ETHNICITY

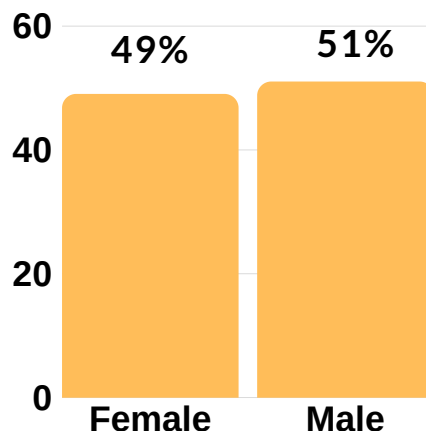


Cadets (7-9)
